

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS POLICY COLLEGE OF BUSINESS

Louisiana Tech's College of Business seeks to assist students in determining and achieving appropriate educational objectives. Part of the College's responsibility to present and potential students, and to the general public, is to admit only those students who, by past educational preparation and demonstrated capability, are prepared to complete their intended curriculum at the College of Business' required level of quality.

All beginning freshmen must meet certain minimum grade requirements before being admitted to the College of Business. The requirements also apply to transfer students from other colleges of the University and transfers from other institutions.

The minimum requirements for admittance into the College are as follows:

1. One quarter with at least eight hours completed and a minimum GPA of 3.0. In addition, student must have completed English 100/101 and Math 100/101 (or his/her first required Math course).

OR

2. Two quarters with at least 16 hours completed and a minimum 2.5 GPA. In addition, student must have completed English 100/101 and Math 100/101.

OR

3. Three quarters with at least 24 hours completed and a minimum 2.0 GPA. In addition, student must have completed English 100/101 and Math 100/101.

OR

4. Four or more quarters with a full load and a minimum 2.0 GPA on total hours attempted, and not on academic probation or suspension. In addition, student must have completed English 100/101 and Math 100/101.

Students seeking admission to the College of Business are cautioned as follows:

1. No 400-level business courses may be taken prior to admission to the College, and a limited number of 300-level courses may be taken.

2. A student must be admitted to and be enrolled in the College for the senior year to receive a baccalaureate degree.

3. If a student has completed the first two years of the curriculum, then the student may take no more than six semester hours of new business courses per quarter (does not include courses being repeated).

4. A student desiring to pursue a degree in business must have at least a 1.5 cumulative grade-point average to be listed as enrolled in the College. A student with an average below 1.5 will be required to change his/her major to a degree program outside of Business.

5. If suspended during this trial period, a student probably is making inadequate progress toward admission and should cease taking business courses and consider changing educational objectives.
